The special meeting of Mifflinburg Borough Council was called to order at 6:45 PM.

Visitors present at this meeting were Vickie Reichenbach, Don Reichenbach, and Murrie Zlotziver.

Mr. Don and Mrs. Vickie Reichenbach, owners of the property located at 416 Chestnut Street, attended tonight's meeting to see about obtaining under the sidewalk drainage at his property. Borough Council directed Mrs. Metzger to bring this matter up at the next job conference for the Chestnut Street Reconstruction Project.

Mr. Murrie Zlotziver, Elm Street Manager for the Mifflinburg Heritage and Revitalization Association (MHRA), presented the proposals for the design of the next phase of the Residential Reinvestment grant for the Mifflinburg Elm Street Project; Green Street between 5<sup>th</sup> Street and 6<sup>th</sup> Street. The proposals were received on Monday, July 29, 2013 at 3:00 PM. There were three (3) proposals received and are as follows:

A copy of the tabulation for the proposals is included in the information tonight. Mr. Zlotziver informed Borough Council that MHRA is recommending that Borough Council take action to award the design of the next phase of the Residential Reinvestment grant to Larson Design Group.

Mayor Cooney reminded Borough Council that at the Tuesday June 18, 2013 regular Borough Council meeting they requested a temporary traffic change to PennDOT to convert 3<sup>rd</sup> Street from Chestnut Street to Market Street to a one-way street traveling south until the Chestnut Street Reconstruction Project has been completed. Mayor Cooney suggested that the one-way restriction on 3<sup>rd</sup> Street be removed. Mr. Steese expressed that he believes the traffic change has been working really well and that Borough Council should consider a permanent traffic change to convert 3<sup>rd</sup> Street to a one-way street. Mrs. Metzger reported that Mr. Snook and Mr. Rohland have scheduled a Park & Recreation, Street & Alleys Committee meeting for Tuesday, August 13, 2013 to discuss making a permanent traffic change to convert 3<sup>rd</sup> Street to a one-way street and the repairs needed to the Mifflinburg Hose Company Building located at 325 Chestnut Street. A discussion was held; Borough Council requested that the one-way restriction on 3<sup>rd</sup> Street to be removed.
