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The regular meeting of Mifflinburg Borough Council was called to order at 7:00 PM.

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There was one (1) visitor present at this meeting which was Kim Sawyer.

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Mrs. Kim Sawyer, representing the First Evangelical Lutheran Church's (located at 404 Market Street) Buggytown Workcamp, attended tonight's meeting with regard to the 2015 Buggytown Workcamp event that is scheduled to be held in Mifflinburg on June 21-27, 2015. Mrs. Sawyer reported that this event was held in Mifflinburg in 2005 and in 2010. Mrs. Sawyer explained that nearly 400 youth and adults volunteer a week of their time to provide free home repairs/improvements to local homeowners of Union and Snyder counties. The volunteers will sleep on air mattresses in temporary bedrooms set up in the Mifflinburg Intermediate School's (located at 250 Mabel Street) gymnasium and classrooms. These services are offered to elderly, handicapped, disabled, single parents, or any lower-income residents in need of home repairs/improvements. Mrs. Sawyer clarified that the Workcamp won't help with repairs/improvements to rentals; they don't want to improve the home and then have the landlord evict the tenants. The Workcamp doesn't ask what the residents' income is or what their resources are. Mrs. Sawyer stated that each volunteer pays for the privilege of working in the community. Workcamp registration fees and monies raised by the church and other area churches and organizations are used to cover the costs for food, insurance and building supplies. All building materials will be purchased at Mifflinburg Lumber and Building Supply (8200 Old Turnpike Road-Mifflinburg), youth groups will be purchasing snacks at area businesses, vehicles used to transport the crews each day to the sites will be filling their tanks with gasoline at local stations, and campers will be donating canned goods for the Mifflinburg food bank, Overall this camp will be a boost to the local economy as well as a much needed service to the homeowners that they are serving. Mrs. Sawyer informed Borough Council that she is present at tonight's meeting because in 2005 and 2010, Borough Council was kind enough to provide free use of the Mifflinburg Community Park and Pool for the Group Workcamp participants. Borough Council action is requested to provide free use of the Mifflinburg Community Park and Pool again on Wednesday, June 24, 2015. Mrs. Sawyer stated that the Workcamp volunteers would probably arrive at the Park around 1:00 or 2:00 PM and leave by 6:00 PM.

Mayor Cooney inquired how many of the Group Workcamp participants utilized the Mifflinburg Community Pool in 2005 and in 2010. Mrs. Sawyer reported that there were approximately 187 participants who utilized the Mifflinburg Community Pool the one time and approximately 220 volunteers the other time.

Mr. Snook reported that Mrs. Erin Threet, HRG, Inc., has been made aware that as work progressed in the 200 block of the Cherry Alley Reconstruction Project, it was determined that portions of the alley were constructed on unsuitable bearing materials and therefore required over-excavation and replacement with suitable bearing material. This work is provided for in the contract documents, but was not accounted for in the bid for the project because the condition of subgrade was unknown prior to the removal of existing pavement. HRG, Inc. is recommending that Borough Council take action to approve Work Change Directive No. 1 to Gutelius Excavating, Inc. for over-excavation and replacement of the unsuitable bearing mater. The anticipated increase in the contract price associated with this work is currently estimated at approximately \$8,000.00 based on a field view performance on Wednesday, September 10, 2014. A copy of the Work Change Directive is attached to tonight's Engineer's Report for Borough Council review. Borough Council action is requested on this matter.

Mrs. Hackenberg informed Borough Council that Mrs. Erin Threet, HRG, Inc. contacted her with regard to this matter since Mrs. Metzger is on vacation and Mr. Jason Mitchell, the Borough Public Works Supervisor, was unavailable.
